Below you’ll find a supply list along with some homework!

It’s always best to get a “jump start” with the appliqué part of any project. ☐



First the Homework

Step 1. Remove all fusible web sheets from this package.

Please follow the directions found on **each page**, stating how much fabric is needed AND how to fuse the pieces to the fabrics.

NOTE: I did not state the fabric color for pages 17 & 18 (the Adirondack chairs) – I made my ADK chairs “pine” green, but you may want to choose a different color.

Step 2. Time to cut out the appliqué pieces, BUT, before cutting out any of these patterns, you will need to get 7 large zip-top baggies and label them as follows 1.

Background

2. LH (Lakehouse)
3. LT (Lean-To Point)
4. Pine
5. Birch
6. Misc. (all B, F & TC)
7. Lake

Step 3. Now, cut out the patterns on the black lines, but Do NOT peel the paper from the appliqué pieces. NOTE: If the paper part of your fusible web starts to peel away – just iron it again with a medium hot iron, let cool, and continue to cut out the shape.

Place the appliqué pieces into the “corresponding” baggie, as stated on the appliqué sheets.

Step 4. Be sure to bring your appliqué “baggies” to class, *along with the remaining fabrics* and pattern.

Second Part - The Supply List

__ Backing fabric - 48” x 41” ∴ PLEASE precut to size! ☐

__ Batting - Quilter’s Dream Request is preferred - 48” x 41” - again please precut!

__ Sewing machine with walking foot and darning foot. (a MUST) (bring all your feet! ☐)

__ extra sewing machine needles (80/12 or 70/10 are good)

__ a few extra empty bobbins

__ appliqué pressing sheet (definitely needed!)

and *filled* bobbins

__ small micro-sharp pointed appliqué scissors

Some colors will

__ rotary cutter

__ 6” x 24” ruler - or - your favorite ruler

monofilament

__ cutting mat (18” x 24” or larger)

__ 20 or so curved #2 safety pins (personal favorite)

__ 505 basting spray (if you don’t bring 505 spray, please bring extra safety pins for sandwiching.

__ straight pins & *magnetic* pin holder

∴ THREADS,

You will need threads

to match your fabrics!

be able to do “double duty”.

You may also use clear

thread.

✕ **LABEL your belongings!**

quilting gloves fabric marking pens
 seam ripper extension cord

Optional, but nice to have - travel iron ironing mat table top Ott light (no floor models, please) slide-on table extension for your sewing machine OR a *portable* sewing machine table.
