

# “Bridge of Flowers”

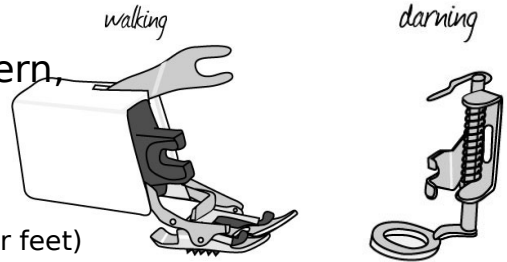
## one day Class

### Supplies and jump-start list



Besides the fabrics listed on back of your pattern, you will also need . . . . .

- sewing machine (oiled & cleaned )
- walking foot (VERY IMPORTANT!)
- darning or appliqué foot
- extra needles (#80/12 is fine)
- also #70 or #75 quilting machine needle for appliqué
- threads for piecing AND to match appliqué pieces - OR - clear monofilament thread



(best to bring ALL your feet)

- rotary cutter with new blade
- rulers:  24" ruler  12½" square
- cutting mat (18" x 24", if you have one)
- 505 basting spray  this is a “must have” (for sandwiching)
- small appliqué scissors with micro-sharp points
- straight pins & magnetic pin holder
- quilting gloves
- 5 sheets lite paper-backed fusible web (ex. light steam-a-seam OR Print-N-Fuse)
- 1 piece of parchment paper 9" x 36" (not wax paper) -or- a very large appliqué pressing sheet.
- lunch and beverage (Chocolate is always good, too!)

**Jump Start your Bridge!** Want to do a little “homework” before class?

- Cut your batting AND backing fabric to 16" x 42", EACH
- Get 3 large ziptop baggies – label them #1, #2, & #3.

Baggie #1

- Cut inside borders (dark green, G1) 3 strips – 1" x WOF (width of fabric) – place into baggie #1.
- Cut outside borders (light green, G4) 3 strips – 2½" x WOF – place into baggie #1.

Baggie #2

- also from dark green (G1) cut a piece that is 4" x 34" and place into baggie #2.
- place your beige “bridge” fabric (which is 4½" x WOF) into baggie #2.
- place your “sky” AND “water” fabric into baggie #2.

Baggie #3

\_\_ From this kit, cut apart pages 4, 6 & 8 on the dashed lines. Fuse sections to the "WRONG" side of your fabrics.

□ No need to fuse the hillside (page 2) and the bridge (page 3) - we'll do them in class!

\_\_ cut out all pieces and place into baggie #3, along with ALL remaining sci
