

"Loon Lake" Workshop with Sue Pritt

Thank you for signing up for our one day workshop with designer/teacher, Sue Pritt.

This project is a perfect choice for beginners to Sue's type of appliqué!

You'll learn to use a Placement Guide with your Appliqué Pressing Sheet. Also quilting as you go
AND how to make and attach two-fabric binding completely by machine!

We'll be starting off the class with simple piecing AND sandwiching and quilting!

Please have your backing & batting ready to go!

And, besides your pattern & fabrics, please bring the following

- sewing machine (oiled, cleaned and must know how to thread & use your machine)
 - walking foot (VERY IMPORTANT!)
 - appliqué (or darning) foot
 - threads to match appliqué pieces
 - filled bobbins to match appliqué
 - extra needles & extra bobbins
 - rotary cutter with new blade
 - iron and ironing pad (unless supplied by shop or guild)
 - rulers: 24" ruler 12 1/2" square
 - cutting mat -18"x 24" is a good size
 - 505 or Mettler basting spray (only these allowed, please)
 - small appliqué scissors with micro-sharp points
 - long straight pins & magnetic pin holder
 - quilting gloves
 - erasable OR washable fabric marking pen or pencil
 - appliqué pressing sheet
 - extension cord (at least a 9 foot cord)
- } These may be supplied
by shop or quilt.
- safety pins if NOT using spray

Jump Start Directions for those who want to get a bit of a start with this project!

Please cut your Backing Fabric AND Batting to 18"w x 16"h

Cut your Borders Inside Borders (Black)– cut THREE 1" x 21"

Outside Borders (Black & White Print) – Cut three 2-1/2" x 21"

Cut the Flange Binding . . . Black fabric – cut 3 strips – 1-1/2" x 21"

Black & White Print – cut 3 strips - 1-1/4" x 21"

Cut the Background Lake Water – cut 10-1/2" wide by 6" high

Sky – cut 10-1/2" wide by 3-1/2" high

} You may sew them together,
with a 1/4" seam.

You also have the option of fusing and cutting the appliqué before class, HOWEVER it's NOT required!
You'll have plenty of time to do this in class.
