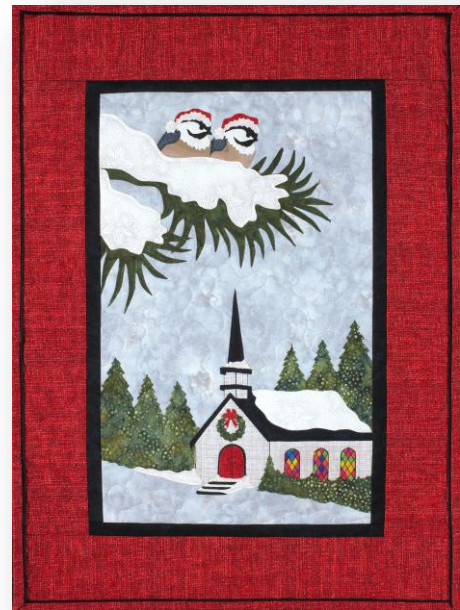


# “Christmas in the Pines”

## Supply List & Jump Start sheet for Workshop/Class



Thank you for signing up for our one day workshop.

Learn or brush up on techniques of raw-edge fusible appliqué, free motion quilting, and quilting ‘as-you-go’; with hints, tips and fun throughout the day!

We’ll be starting off the class with sandwiching and quilting!

Please have your backing & batting ready to go!

And, besides your pattern & fabrics, please bring the following . . . .

\_\_ sewing machine (oiled, cleaned and must know how to thread & use your machine)

\_\_ walking foot (VERY IMPORTANT!)

\_\_ open toe appliqué (or darning) foot

\_\_ threads to match appliqué pieces

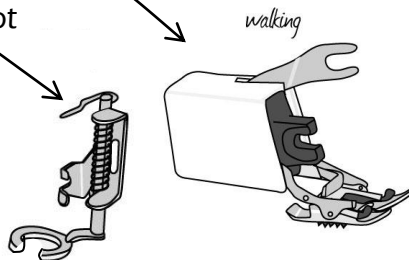
\_\_ filled bobbins to match appliqué

\_\_ extra needles & extra bobbins

\_\_ rotary cutter with new blade

\_\_ rulers: \_\_24” ruler \_\_12 ½”square

\_\_ cutting mat -18”x 24” is a good size



} These are optional & may be supplied by shop

\_\_ 505 or Mettler basting spray (no others allowed, please)

\_\_ safety pins if NOT using spray

\_\_ small appliqué scissors with micro-sharp points

\_\_ long straight pins & magnetic pin holder

\_\_ quilting gloves

\_\_ erasable OR washable fabric marking pen or pencil

\_\_ appliqué pressing sheet

\_\_ extension cord (at least a 9 foot cord)

\_\_ iron and ironing pad (unless supplied by shop or guild)

\_\_ lunch and beverage (Chocolate is always good, too!)

**\* If you do not have a walking foot OR appliqué foot – please buy or borrow them! They are required for this class!**

**\* PLEASE \*  
PRECUT your Backing Fabric and Batting!  
20”w x 26”h

## “Jump Start” for cutting AND appliqué for “Christmas in the Pines”

**NOTE: This sheet is NOT the pattern! It's for use prior to the class!**

### Step 1- Cutting the “B’s” – Backing, Batting, Borders, Binding and Background.

Backing fabric & Batting	cut 20”w x 26”h <i>each</i>
Inside Border (black)	cut two – 1” x WOF (WOF at least 42”)
Outside Border (red)	cut two – 3-1/4” x WOF
Flange Binding (black)	cut two – 1-1/2” x WOF
(red)	cut two – 1-1/4” x WOF
Background White/Grey;	cut 10-1/2”w x 16-1/2”h

*If you have done fusible web appliqué before you may want to get a jump start on fusing and cutting, HOWEVER, we can do this in class.*

*The following directions are ONLY if you feel comfortable doing some things on your own.*

**NOTE: not all paper backed fusible webs are created equal! The following are the ones that we have used and know work well – We cannot guarantee the success of any others. So we recommend one of these . . . Lite Heat & Bond, Soft Fuse or Flexi-Fuse.**

**Step 2** - Trace OR photocopy all the appliqué shapes from pages 2, 3, & 4 onto the paper side of Fusible web sheets. Use either a light fusible web for tracing – OR – Use “printable” fusible web sheets with your inkjet printer.

• Cut apart the sections of the fusible sheets on the dashed lines. ♡

• Do NOT trace or photocopy page 5

That page is the placement guides for the church & chickadees, not an appliqué page!

**Step 3** - Fabrics – use unwashed fabrics (OR washed fabrics, but do NOT add fabric softener).  
TIP: Batiks are *always* best for raw edge fusible web appliqué!

**Step 4** - Cut your fabric to the size listed on each section of the appliqué pages.

**Step 5** - Fusing – lay fabric, ♡ RIGHT SIDE DOWN ♡ on ironing pad. Lay fusible web sheet, sticky side down over fabric. The paper side that you traced or photocopied will be *facing up*.

**Step 6** - With a hot iron (wool or cotton setting), PRESS the fusible web sheets to the fabrics. Approximately 6to 8 seconds. Do NOT slide the iron around, instead “lift and press”.

**Step 7** - After fusing all the appliqué sheets to your fabrics, cut out the shapes on the traced lines.  
TIP: for tiny pieces, cut a quarter inch margin around the shape; you'll cut them out completely in class!  
• Do NOT peel the paper from the back of the appliqué shapes.

**Step 8** - Separate cut out shapes according to their “part number”, NOT by color!  
Example all “CH” shapes in the “CH” baggie, all “B” shapes in a “B” baggies, etc, etc.  
Place appliqué shapes without part numbers in one large baggie.

Be sure to bring your baggies to class, AND any leftover fabric!  
(You never know if you might need a bit more.) ☺
