
"Quilting at the Lake" Workshop with Sue Pritt



Thank you for signing up for our workshop with designer/teacher, Sue Pritt. Learn or brush up on techniques of raw-edge fusible appliqué, free motion quilting, and quilting 'as-you-go'; with hints, tips and fun throughout the day! We'll be sandwiching and quilting at this class, so please have your backing & batting ready to go! And, besides your pattern & fabrics, please bring the following....

- _____ sewing machine (oiled, cleaned and must know how to thread & use your machine)
- ___ walking foot (VERY IMPORTANT!)
- __ appliqué (or darning) foot
- __ threads to match appliqué pieces
- __ filled bobbins to match appliqué
- __ extra needles & extra bobbins
- __ rotary cutter with new blade
- ____rulers: ___24" ruler ___12 ½"square
- ___ cutting mat -18"x 24" is a good size
- ____ Mettler OR 505 basting spray (no others allowed, please)
- _____ safety pins if NOT using spray
- ____ small appliqué scissors with micro-sharp points
- ____*long* straight pins & <u>magnetic</u> pin holder
- __ quilting gloves
- ___ erasable OR washable fabric marking pen or pencil
- __ appliqué pressing sheet
- ____ iron and ironing pad (unless supplied by shop or guild)
- ____ lunch and beverage (Chocolate is always good, too!)

* If you do not have a walking foot OR appliqué foot – please buy or borrow them! They are <u>required</u> for this class!



* PLEASE * PRECUT your Backing Fabric and Batting! 32" x 42" <u>each</u> See reverse side for more pre-cutting!

"Jump Start" for cutting AND making appliqué for "Quilting at the Lake"

- Backing, Batting & Binding <u>Backing & Batting</u> - Cut <u>each</u> 32"w x 42"h, set aside. <u>Binding</u> – (light grey OR quilters choice) Cut 4 strips – 1½" x WOF (*this is for <u>single fold</u> binding*)
- 2. The Window Cut AND place all cut pieces into a large baggie labeled <u>"window".</u>

Window panes /sky fabric/
cut one strip 6"h x WOF - from that strip
____ cut six pieces, each $6\frac{1}{2}$ "w x 6"h -
Sashing Shadow (tan)Sashing Shadow (tan)cut 2 strips - 1" x WOF - from them cut ...
____ six - 6" pieces
____ six - 7" piecesSashing bars (pine green)
cut 3 strips 1½" x WOF - from them cut
____ three - 24" pieces
____ eight - 6½" pieces

- The Background Cut the following fabrics AND place in baggie labeled "<u>background</u>". . .
 _____ Sky fabric 22¹/₂"w x 4"h
 - __ Lake water 22½"w x 10"h
- 4. More cutting Cut the following and place in baggie labeled "<u>background"</u> (step 3)
 - ____ From off-white fabric, cut 1 piece that is 30" x 6"
 - ____ From tan fabric cut 3 strips, 1¹/₄" by width of fabric
 - ____ From Window Frame fabric cut 3 strips, 42"L x 3¹/₄"W
- 5. Trace OR photocopy all the appliqué patterns onto the paper side of fusible web sheets.
- Use either a light fusible web for tracing OR Use "printable" fusible web sheets with your inkjet printer. • Do NOT trace or photocopy pages 9, 10, 11 and 12. They are the placement guides, not patterns!
- 6. Fabrics use unwashed fabrics (OR washed fabrics, but do NOT add fabric softener). TIP: Batiks are *always* best for raw edge fusible web appliqué!
- 7. Cut your fabric to the size listed on each section of the appliqué pages.
- 8. Fusing lay fabric, RIGHT SIDE DOWN on ironing pad. Lay your printed (or traced) fusible web sheet, sticky side down over fabric. The paper side that you traced or photocopied will be facing up.
- 9. With a hot iron (wool or cotton setting), PRESS the fusible web sheets to the fabrics do NOT slide the iron around, instead "lift and press".

NOTE: the treeline & high peaks should be fused as ONE piece, see directions on page 3 & 4.

- 10. After fusing all the appliqué sheets to your fabrics, Cut out the patterns on the traced lines.
 TIP: for tiny pieces, just cut a quarter inch margin all around shape, you'll cut them out completely in class!
 Do NOT peel the paper from the appliqué pieces.
- 11. Separate cut out pieces according to their "part number", and place in separate baggies. Example, all "LS" pieces in one baggie, and all "RS" in another baggie, etc., etc. Pieces without a part number may go in one large baggie.
- 12. Be sure to bring your all your baggies to class, <u>AND any leftover fabric.</u> (You never know if you might need a bit more. ⁽²⁾)

Don't forget your walking foot - AND – open-toe, free motion (darning) foot! See you Soon!
