



Welcome to the “Cats & Hoots “ class with designer/teacher, Sue Pritt!

Thank you for signing up for this one class!

Date(s) _____ OR _____

We start at 9:30 and end around 3:00 or so
With a half-hour lunch break.

This is a one day class where you’ll make both “Scaredy Cats & Boo Hoots”!
Please purchase all of the fabrics BEFORE coming to class AND there is homework, too! ☺

Since our time together is limited, it’s best to “jump start” any pre-cutting
AND appliqué for your project!

NOTE: make sure you bring your backing fabric and batting to class, we will be
“sandwiching” the quilts that day, AND you should also purchase 505 Basting Spray –
sorry, NO other brands allowed in class!

OK, let’s get started

1. Pre-cutting Please cut the following fabrics – LABEL them – place them in a zip-top baggie

- ___ Backing AND Batting – cut TWO – 13” x 32” each (two backings AND two battings)
- ___ Grass – Cut TWO – 6” x 3½” each
- ___ Sky – Cut TWO – 6” x 22 ½” each
- ___ inside border fabric – cut 4 strips – ¾” x WOF – cut off 8” from each strip – place all in baggie.
- ___ outside border fabric – cut 4 strips – 2¼” each- cut off 12” from each strip (remaining outside border fabric is for your binding)
- ___ label and set aside two baggies – one for both trees, and the other for all remaining appliqué.

2. Next – the Appliqué

___ A You will need to trace or photocopy all the appliqué patterns on pages 2, 3, & 4 – Do NOT trace the placement guides at the top of page four!

VERY Important! READ the instructions that is included in your fusible web, not all fusible webs are the same!

___ B. Now that your pages are traced (or copied) onto fusible web sheets – you will need to cut some sheets apart on the dashed lines before fusing to fabrics. The pattern pages state the amount of fabric needed for each section.

___ C. Fabrics – use unwashed fabrics (OR washed fabrics, but do NOT add fabric softener in washer or dryer). TIP: Batiks are *always* best for raw edge fusible web appliqué!

___ D. Fusing – lay fabric, ◀ RIGHT SIDE DOWN ▶ on ironing pad. Lay fusible web sheet, sticky side down over fabric. The paper side that you traced or photocopied will be facing up.

NOTE: to make both trees, cut two pieces of “tree”, 6” x 21”, each. cut the fusible web tree sections apart for each tree, position them, sticky side down, on the wrong side of the tree fabric, matching the “A” and “B” letters. Fuse, cut out and place in “tree” baggie.

___ E. With a hot iron (wool or cotton setting), PRESS the fusible web sheets to the fabrics - do NOT slide the iron around, instead “lift and press”.

__ F. After fusing all the appliqué sheets to your fabrics, Cut out the patterns on the traced lines.

• Do NOT peel the paper from the appliqué pieces.

Place the appliqué pieces into "ALL" remaining appliqué baggie .

__ G. Be sure to bring all your baggies to class, AND any leftover fabric.

(You never know if you might need a bit more ☺)

3. Here is the remaining "homework" - the list of items that you'll need to bring

__ Sewing machine with walking foot and open toe darning foot. (a MUST) (bring all your feet! ☺)

__ extra sewing machine needles

__ a few extra empty bobbins

__ appliqué pressing sheet

__ Threads – to match appliqué fabrics (or clear monofilament thread)

__ filled bobbins to match appliqué fabrics

(bring as many as needed, so you won't have to fill bobbins in class!)

__ small micro-sharp pointed appliqué scissors

__ rotary cutter

__ 6" x 24" ruler – or - your favorite ruler

__ cutting mat (18" x 24" or larger)

__ 20 or so curved #2 safety pins (personal favorite)

__ 505 basting spray (**Sorry, No other brand allowed in class**)

__ quilters flower head pins (or similar) & magnetic pin holder

__ quilting gloves

__ tweezers

__ Erasable fabric marking pens

__ black fabric marking pens

__ seam ripper

Optional, but nice to have –

__ slide-on table extension for your sewing machine

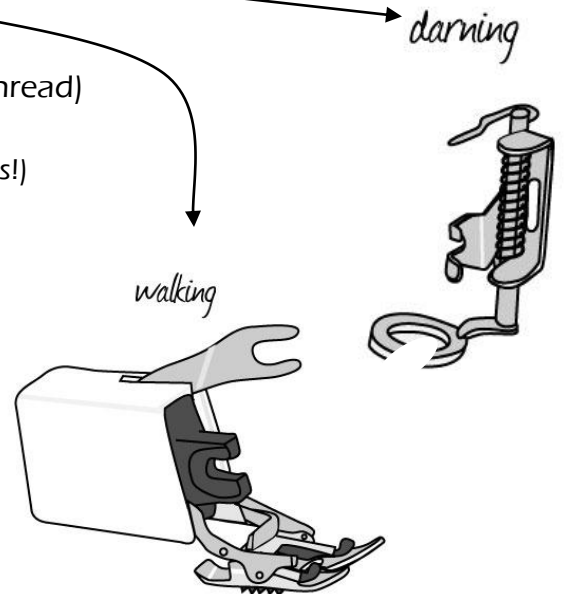
__ extension cord

__ travel iron (if shop or guild does NOT supply them)

__ ironing mat (if shop or guild does NOT supply them)

__ table top Ott light (no floor models, please)

__ EZ Sew portable sewing machine table (if space allows)
