



## Welcome to the “Witchy Ladies “workshop with designer/teacher, Sue Pritt!

Thank you for signing up for our one day workshop!

We start at 9:30 and end around 3:00 or so  
With a half-hour lunch break.

If you purchased a fabric kit – please lay out ALL fabrics before cutting or fusing to be sure you have what you need.

AND now for the pre-homework - Since our time together is limited, it's best to “jump start” any pre-cutting AND appliqué for your project!

NOTE: If you did purchase a kit – it probably does NOT include the backing or batting, so you will need to purchase them. You will need them for this class!

You should also purchase 505 Basting Spray – sorry, NO other brands allowed in class!

Please NOTE: You will NOT be able to finish all three ladies in this one day class, but you will have a chance to try every technique needed to finish this project on your own.

OK, let's get started . . . .

1. Pre-cutting - Please cut the following fabrics – LABEL them – place them in one large zip-top baggie.

\_\_\_ Backing AND Batting – 34” x 31” *each*

\_\_\_ Grass – 28½”w x 1½”h

\_\_\_ Sidewalk – 28½”w x 1½”h

\_\_\_ Sky – 28½”w x 10½”h

\_\_\_ inside border fabric – cut 4 strips – 1” each

\_\_\_ outside border fabric – cut 4 strips – 3” each (remaining outside border fabric is for your binding)

2. Next – the Appliqué!

Before cutting out any appliqué patterns, you will need to get 10 large zip-top baggies . . . .

Label them “A” to “J”.

**VERY Important! →READ the instructions that come with your fusible web, not all fusible webs are the same!**

A. Trace OR photocopy all the appliqué patterns (pages 5 thru 14)

Use either a Lite, paper-backed, fusible web sheet for tracing with a pencil (ex. Lite Steam-a-Seam) – OR –  
Use “printable” paper-backed fusible web sheets. (ex - Print-N-Fuse) with your inkjet printer.

B. Now that your pages are traced (or copied) onto fusible web sheets –  
you will need to cut some sheets apart on the dashed lines before fusing to your fabrics.  
The pattern pages state the amount of fabric needed for each section.

C. Fabrics – use unwashed fabrics (OR washed fabrics, but do NOT add fabric softener in washer or dryer).  
TIP: Batiks are *always* best for raw edge fusible web appliqué!

D. Fusing – lay fabric, **RIGHT SIDE DOWN** on ironing pad. Lay fusible web sheet, sticky side down over fabric. The paper side that you traced or photocopied will be facing up.

NOTE: to make both trees, cut a piece of black fabric, 10" x 24", cut the fusible web tree section sheets apart for each tree, position them, sticky side down, on the wrong side of the black fabric, matching the "A" and "B" letters. Fuse, cut out and place trees in "J" baggie.

E. With a hot iron (wool or cotton setting), PRESS the fusible web sheets to the fabrics - do NOT slide the iron around, instead "lift and press".

F. After fusing all the appliqué sheets to your fabrics, Cut out the patterns on the traced lines.  
Do NOT peel the paper from the appliqué pieces.  
Place appliqué pieces into "corresponding" baggies, matching their "part number".

G. Be sure to bring your appliqué "baggies" to class, AND any leftover fabric.  
(You never know if you might need a bit more ☺)

H. If you *still* want to do a bit more cutting before class – you may cut, label (& sew) the shop sections together following directions on pages 1 & 2.

3. Here is the remaining "homework" - the list of items that you'll need to bring . . . .

\_\_ Sewing machine with walking foot and open toe darning foot. ( a MUST) (bring all your feet! ☺)

\_\_ extra sewing machine needles

\_\_ a few extra empty bobbins

\_\_ appliqué pressing sheet

\_\_ Threads – to match appliqué fabrics (or clear monofilament thread)

\_\_ filled bobbins to match appliqué fabrics

(bring as many as needed, so you won't have to fill bobbins in class!)

\_\_ small micro-sharp pointed appliqué scissors

\_\_ rotary cutter

\_\_ 6" x 24" ruler – or - your favorite ruler

\_\_ cutting mat (18" x 24")

\_\_ 20 or so curved #2 safety pins (personal favorite)

\_\_ 505 basting spray (**Sorry, No other brand allowed in class**)

\_\_ quilters flower head pins (or similar) & magnetic pin holder

\_\_ quilting gloves

\_\_ tweezers

\_\_ Erasable fabric marking pens

\_\_ black fabric marking pens

\_\_ seam ripper

**Optional, but nice to have –**

\_\_ slide-on table extension for your sewing machine

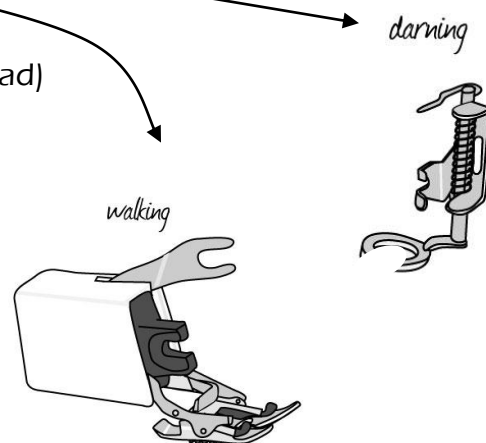
\_\_ extension cord

\_\_ travel iron

\_\_ ironing mat

\_\_ table top Ott light (no floor models, please)

\_\_ EZ Sew portable sewing machine table (if space allows)
